

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The Honourable Lincoln M. Alexander was born in 1922 in Toronto. He served during the Second World War for Canada and then studied at McMaster University where he graduated in Arts and Law. He became a partner in a Hamilton law firm and was the first Black Member of Parliament in 1968; going on to serve as Minister of Labour in 1979-1980.


